The Feast of the Epiphany on January 6th (Little Christmas) On this day we celebrate the arrival of the Three Wise men from the east to the manger of Jesus, where they offered the first Christmas gifts ever given to anyone ~ the gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. It is also the official ending of the Christmas season.



Saint Thomas Aquinas Feast Day (priest and doctor of the Church; patron of all universities and of students) on January 28th. On this day we honor our Parish Patron. Saint Thomas was one of the greatest and most influential theologians of all time. He was canonized in 1323 and declared Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius V.



Catholic Schools Week: January 27th – February 2nd. This week we show our appreciation for Catholic Schools in the United States and in the Diocese of Paterson in particular, Reverend George A. Brown School, Pope John XXIII Middle School and Pope John XXIII Regional High School under the leadership of the Catholic Academy of Sussex County.
